

As we enter Holy Week and then into the Great 50 Days of Easter, I find myself wondering where are the signs of new life? Here are some signs I see and hear as I write this.

As I look out my office windows, shoots of green are sprouting up from the plants that have been dormant during the winter. Grass is making its vibrant colors and soon leaves on the mature trees throughout the neighborhood will be taking up space on the branches, adding new life and beauty.

Is it something that's happening when you serve through Epiphany?

I'm looking forward to celebrating the heart of our Christian faith. As we journey from the Table and foot washing on Maundy Thursday, to the cross on Good Friday, and finally, the empty tomb on Easter Sunday, I want to invite you celebrate these days with holy wonder and awe. The mystery of our faith is unfolding during these days and it is a thing of beauty that God does in our midst.

and Vicar Christina have led Wednesday evening services which includes reflections on beloved Old Testament readings and communion.


The congregation continues to rejoice with the activities of Vicar Christina. She is interacting with the students and providing an appreciated presence at Wake Forest. Together they are participating with other LSM groups throughout the ACC in a fund-raising challenge. We have been blessed to be selected to continue our involvement in the Vicar program. Our next Vicar has been matched with us and we look forward to his arrival in August.

The church's outreach programs continue to be appropriately funded by the congregation. We should all be proud of all that the congregation is involved in.

Lastly, Pastor Russell has been given Council approval to submit a Reflective Leadership grant application to the Synod. The plan will include time for retrospective and prospective reflection by Pastor on personal and ELCE ministry and includes coursework and travel. A goal would be to consider forming a network with other similar sized congregations. The submitted proposal will be shared with Council (as will the final report upon completion). The plan will shift some responsibility (1-2 days per month) usually performed by Pastor to others. Pastoral coverage (e.g., worship) will be provided.

The Council wishes to thank every member and friend of the congregation for what they do for the church, and hopes that their Lenten journeys are meaningful as we look forward to the coming celebration of Easter.

Augsburg Lutheran Church and Lutheran Church of the Epiphany, in partnership with Lutheridge Camp in Arden, NC, will host Lutheroad Day Camp

on June 12-16, 2023. Lutheroad is open to all children who are currently completing kindergarten through 5th grade. It will be staffed with college-age staff from Lutheridge, trained in youth ministry, who will act as program leaders and counselors for the campers. Campers will be involved in Bible studies, recreation, small groups, worship, crafts, games, and service projects. The daily schedule will be Monday-Thursday 9:00-4:00, and Friday 9:00-12:00. Campers attending Lutheroad will need to bring a lunch each day, and a water bottle. Snacks will be provided each day. On Thursday evening, Augsburg will host an Ice Cream Social where the campers will showcase what they have learned throughout the week. On Friday, camp ends before lunch at 12:00.

Your Voice Matters

One of the things I hear with disturbing frequency goes something like this: "This is a top-down church. The ELCA churchwide expression, the churchwide assembly, and the synod make decisions that are completely out of touch with me and my congregation. Nobody ever asks our opinion. The churchwide and synod actions don't reflect the views of my community, my congregation, and me."

I actually ponder that a lot. I worry about it a lot. I firmly believe, even amid today's culture wars, polarizations, and anxiety, that most of us ultimately don't have to "have our way." But just like in interpersonal relationships, we do need to be seen, sincerely heard and understood, acknowledged, and valued. Minus any one of those things, we can't really be in relationship together in any hopeful way.

Congregations are the foundational Word-Sacrament-and-Serving building block of this church in its three expressions. There is no synod or churchwide expression without congregations. Synods are just congregations working together to do things we can't do on our own. Like agencies and institutions such as Lutheran Men in Mission—celebrating 100 years this month and providing disaster response, spiritual renewal retreats, and more—Lenoir-Rhyne University. Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary of L-R, Lutheran Services Carolinas, Agape+Kure Beach, NovusWay (Lutheridge and Lutherock in NC), Women of the ELCA Synodical Women's Organization, Lutheran Youth Organization, Twin Lakes, The Mission Fund (supporting 10 mission congregations in NC), Region 9 Archives, the Home Mission Foundation, and the NC Synod Foundation which includes the Michael Peeler and Virginia Casey Funds.

Synods also help facilitate the call process for rostered pastors and deacons as well as Synod Authorized Ministers and Lay Preachers, help congregations with planning and vitality, help manage and fund over a dozen Lutheran campus ministries in NC, manage the Candidacy process for the preparation of rostered ministers, help mediate and guide conflict situations, provide continuing education for both lay and rostered ministers, help provide for the care and nurture and renewal of rostered ministers, help facilitate communication among all members of the NC Synod (are you **signed up for our e-news?**), and help congregations arrange to share ministry or ministers that keep them both vital and sustainable. And much more.

So, now there I go, telling you all what WE do—the NC Synod, the synodical expression of this church—and not listening to your input. So, where is your chance for input? Lots of ways. Those of us on the bishop's staff are eager to be invited into your congregation, and one thing we can do when we come besides preach is to have a session where congregants can bring questions and concerns to us. Another thing you can do is write to or call the synod office. We get lots of calls, letters, and emails. All ELCA social statements provide localized workshops and/or input forms, encouraging the whole population of the ELCA to respond. Synod resolutions and memorials are other opportunities for input. (These used to be discussed at annual spring conference meetings—which, let's face it, had dreadful attendance—but we're hoping to change that with a new format for spring meetings.)
