2023 looks to be an exciting year for Epiphany. But before I talk about 2023, I want to take a minute and close out 2022 by saying "thank you" to all of you. We had a strong year in 2022 and it happened because of you.

2023 marks the 61st year of ministry for Epiphany. We've been through a lot of exciting times together, and this coming year is no exception.

Earlier this fall our Council came up with three key areas of focus for 2023. They are:

1. Renew our church home.

Over the last several years we've done a great job of maintaining our church home with some important things. A couple of examples: many of our HVAC systems have been replaced. We've made the switch to LED lighting thoughout the building. We've replaced the carpet in the narthex. We've replaced the playground equipment. We've upgraded several parts of our "digital" infrastructure.

With all those improvements, we still need to do some work on our facility so it can serve the next generation well. This will most likely mean we will need to have a capital campaign.

2. Enhance communications within our church family.

We continually need to look at how we communicate. The pandemic taught us the importance of live-streaming and Zoom meetings. Are there other steps we need to be taking? For instance, it's been many years since we had an updated pictorial directory.

3. Expand our outreach.

One of the specific things related to this is that we believe God is calling us to help resettle a refugee family coming to our country. Epiphany has done this several times in its history and it is time for us to step up again. We don't know how yet, but we do know this will be something we need to focus on in 2023. How can you help? What gifts and skills do you have to help make these goals happen? I invite you to prayerfully consider how you can serve.


