

Dear Epiphany Disciples,

Happy July! Even though we're in the middle of summer, there's still a lot that God is doing through Epiphany. I wanted to share with you a couple of things.

-July 23 we will be saying goodbye to Vicar Christiana. The hardest part of internship is always saying goodbye to our vicars and this year is certainly no exception. Vicar Christina has done a great job of learning and growing in her pastoral identity. I've appreciated her gifts and skills, and I can't wait for her to serve the church as a pastor.

During worship that Sunday, we will bid Farewell and Godspeed to Vicar Christina. After worship, you are invited to bring your favorite dish to share for a potluck in Vicar Christina's honor.

-Vicar Christina will move out of the Pennington House in early August. After that, the Dwellings' intern, Brittany Perry, will be living there. Brittany is studying to be an ordained deacon, concentrating on Word and Service ministries for the church.

Earlier this Spring, Pastor Emily Norris from the Dwelling let me know that their housing for their intern fell through and she was desperately trying to find a suitable and affordable place for their intern to live. Because our congregation wants the Pennington House to be used for mission and we aren't receiving an intern for the 2023-24 school year, the Congregation Council agreed to let Brittany stay there while she is learning and serving at the Dwelling. I'm glad we were able to partner with our friends at the Dwelling in this unique way.

-I wanted to update you on a few things related to the Capital Campaign. Throughout the month of June, there has been a lot of behind-the-scenes work. One of the highlights of the last month was a gathering on June 12 with several leaders in the congregation for an Anchor Storytelling Training. This part of the campaign isn't about directly raising money, although that's coming later. The hope with this training is that we get better at telling our story about the ways God is changing lives through Epiphany long after we've raised funds at Epiphany.

I've been telling more about Epiphany to our consultants, Deacon Mitzie and Pastor Mike, so that they can tailor this campaign to our congregation. As I've thought about the things to tell them, I've found myself thankful for all the ways we've grown, connected, and served throughout the years. I know there are more ways we've grown as a church than I can remember, and I can't wait for others to share their stories.

-One of the most common questions/comments I've received is, "We know the organ is an issue that needs to be addressed, but what things are we going to do to update our facilities?"

Several years ago, our Management Committee came up with a helpful list of "big ticket" items that need to be replaced. We've done a good job over the last several years of getting to some of those. However, we still need to catch up so that our church facility can continue to be a place of dynamic, active ministry that blesses our church family and community.

We're also going to need everyone to be on the lookout for things that need renewal. Vicar (now Pastor) Heather's internship project evaluated Epiphany's strengths and opportunities to improve our handicap accessibility. What would it look like for our facility to be even better at welcoming all people, regardless of physical ability?

When I looked at the very well-done list from Management, I saw some other things that needed to be improved that weren't on the list. I'm sure there are other things that are missing. Because of that, I'd like to have an event for the congregation to gather and look at the entire church property with fresh eyes. My hope is that we can compile a list of items that we see need to be improved. In other words, I don't want this to be a list only from Pastor Russell or the Management Committee. It's going to take all of us to see and dream how our church property could be made even better than it is. More on that event later but know that I'd like for this to happen this fall.

We also know that we need to add at least one more bank of niches in our columbarium because we have less than 10 empty niches left. As more people choose to be cremated, having additional niches for sale is a wise investment in our future so that people can have their earthly remains interred at our beloved church.

Finally, I want us to dream about Epiphany's facility.

Here's one thing I've been wondering and dreaming about. We have a large flat roof. Epiphany has been doing a lot with care for creation over the years and I've been wondering if we could use our flat roof for solar panels. Imagine the statement it would make to our community that we are committed to caring for God's creation by using renewable energy. Imagine if we could pay less for our electric bill each month and put the savings to grow our ministries at Epiphany.

What if we took the savings and helped rebuild our youth ministries or strengthen our children's ministries? Or what if we put some intentional effort into developing a vibrant senior's ministry at Epiphany? I wonder if there's something else that we believe God is calling to undertake for the sake of the gospel? Of course, dreaming about our facilities isn't just my dream. We need each other to imagine how God call is calling us to use the church facility as tools for ministry.

On Pentecost Sunday when we approved signing a contract with our consultants, we read a passage in worship from Acts 2 where the Spirit is poured out on God's people so that they can dream dreams. The next step in thinking about our facility renewal is to do exactly that. Dream. I invite you to prayerfully think about what kinds of spaces we need and the improvements that need to happen so that we can continue to use this place where so much ministry happens to bless the world God so loves.

I give God thanks for our past, rejoice in what is happening in the present, and look with hope for what will happen in the future at 5220 Silas Creek Parkway.

Hello Epiphany brothers and sisters! These initial weeks of summer have been full of activity for your Church Council. In addition to our regular meetings to monitor and discuss the needs and activities of the congregation, we have been engaging in some of the initial steps of our upcoming

congregational capital campaign efforts.

Our earliest engagements have been focused on how we can best tell the story of who we are here at Epiphany – as a worshiping congregation, a community of believers, a home for learning and faith formation, and as a group committed to many external outreach efforts in the name of Jesus. There are so many special things that God has done and is doing in our congregation, and this effort will give us a great chance to celebrate and proclaim many of those things – as well as focus on what may be required to sustain those priorities into the future.

At our council meeting this month, we also recognized the timing of Juneteenth and spent some time in our devotions prayerfully reflecting on the significance of that observance for the life of our nation. As the date in 1865 when the proclamation (and enforcement) of the abolition of slavery in the United States finally reached communities in Texas, it is a day that marks the end of a tragic chapter in American life and urges us to reflect on both the legacy of that time and the possibilities of a more liberating future. We closed with a prayer that is part of the ELCA's 2019 worship resources on Juneteenth, a portion of which we wanted to share with you below:

O God... Where hearts are fearful and constricted, grant courage and hope. Where anxiety is infectious and widening, grant peace and reassurance. Where impossibilities close every door and window, grant imagination and resistance. Where distrust twists our thinking, grant healing and illumination. Where spirits are daunted and weakened, grant soaring wings, and strengthened dreams.



Summer has arrived, and the EECC is gearing up for a very important part of our calendar year. In July, we will host the NC department of Public Health, Forsyth County Fire Marshall, and the North Carolina Division of Child

Development and Early Education for our annual inspections and reviews. While families and even some staff are planning for some well-needed rest and relaxation, the administrative team is hard at work making sure our classroom environments, indoor and outdoor play spaces, our paperwork, and procedures are all in order.

This past weekend, June 24th, the PALS families, church friends, and many of my staff came together for an extensive workday for the EECC and church grounds. After it rained for so many days in a row, the prospect for the workday was dreary, but the sun came out and the pile of mulch was spread, the new sand was distributed, and the bushes/trees trimmed to a safe and well-manicured height. The bees (yellow-jackets) and poison oak were eradicated, and all six of the picnic tables were freshly re-painted. The summer toys were rotated and the classrooms were refreshed to support the new roster for the summer months. You will see evidence of water play and popsicles in the weeks to come!

Your continued prayers for our early childhood center will be needed to completely bring us back to pre- COVID operations. We currently have need of two more employees to complete our team. The hiring process has been disappointing due to the lack of qualified applicants in this profession. It is hard to keep people when our ten-hour days require attentive and dedicated people to reach above and beyond to help us become the best that we can be. Thank you for your care and concern for the EECC.


Lutheroad Day Camp 2023



There is something in a name.

Beloved Community of Christ. Christ's Beloved Community.

Comunidad Amada de Cristo (Christ's Beloved Community) in Winston-Salem is an ecumenical (Lutheran/Episcopal) and bilingual (Spanish/English) ministry that serves as a food distribution hub for hundreds in that community of south Winston. In fact, over 400 families were served by their food pantry in April alone. A beloved community for the community.

They meet in the building paid forward in mission by the hospitality and eventual closing of Christ Lutheran on that site. Under the leadership of Padre Javier Arias, the worshiping community has exploded in less than a year from around 30 to nearly 130 on Sunday afternoons.

In the last five months, Christ's Beloved Community has confirmed nearly 50 people. In a time when many congregations are rebuilding youth groups, two young people from Christ's Beloved Community are seeking training to be youth advisors so they can walk alongside the youth.

On Sunday, May 21, Bishop Tim Smith gathered with the congregation to preach and confirm 23 young people, preside over first communion for six even younger children, and receive over 20 new members. Bishop Smith prayed over each young person in Spanish, stating each young person's name.

Revive in (Name) the gift of the Holy Spirit; the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and power, the Spirit of knowledge and fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence now and forever. Amen.

Pastor Alfredo Oviedo, Assistant to the Bishop, and Pastor Danielle DeNise, Director for Evangelical Mission, were also present. Pastor Danielle said of the occasion, "It was so clear that the Spirit was in that room with us."

On Saturday, June 3, the Holy Spirit was present in another room as Christ's Beloved Community was received as the newest congregation in the North Carolina Synod.

Synod council member and dean of the Yadkin Conference, Pastor Cassie Overcash, presented the motion to receive the congregation as Father Javier and 15 members of Christ's Beloved Community gathered onstage in front of almost 450 synod leaders.

Those leaders experienced just a taste of the fullness of that ministry, as a picture slideshow scrolled on the ballroom screens and Assistant to the Bishop, Pastor Alfredo Oviedo, offered Spanish translations.

The motion was accepted with overwhelming support, digital fireworks, standing applause, and Father Javier's commitment to this Christ-centered community. He said, "We have planted a beautiful, beautiful bilingual, multicultural, and bi-denominational community. We are blessed by this synod and we hope to grow in faith and numbers."

The whole of the North Carolina Synod celebrates the belovedness of this community and of this momentous occasion. Thanks be to God.
