

From the Pastor

Dear Epiphany Disciples,

Alleluia! Christ is Risen!

As we enter May, I want to share two things:

-First, some exciting news!

I need you to mark your calendars for Sunday, May 28. We will be having a called congregational meeting immediately following worship, around 11:05. The only item of business on the agenda will be the congregation approving a contract for a capital campaign consultant.

I realize it's Memorial Day Weekend, but because we had to coordinate several schedules, this was the best Sunday to have the meeting.

We'll have more information about the details coming soon, but in the meantime, I'll simply ask you to mark your calendars and plan to attend the meeting in person or online.

-Now for some difficult news.

For the last three years, Epiphany has been an internship site to be a part of the formation of the next generation of pastors. I'm thankful for the ongoing ministry of Pastors Jennifer and Heather, and I look forward to seeing the leadership Vicar Christina will offer to God's people once she is ordained. It has been a great joy to host these interns and to see them in ministry.

There is, as you can imagine, a lot of work that goes into assigning interns to congregations. Interns and sites like Epiphany fill out lengthy applications. Those submitted applications get sent to someone at one of our Lutheran seminaries (in our case, it goes to a professor at our seminary in Columbia). Not every intern and site are a match and the seminaries work very hard at trying to match interns with sites like ours so that the intern and congregation have a good experience.

We had been assigned an intern for next year earlier in the spring. Unfortunately, I found out in late April that our assigned intern is not going to do his internship at this time. I can't go into why that happened, but I want to assure you all that this wasn't because of anything we did or didn't do. Epiphany continues to be a desirable site to host interns.

I've spoken with our seminary in Columbia, and it looks like all the interns and internship sites are on solid ground for this coming fall. That means that the odds of us being a site for August 2023-2024 are very slim. If I were a gambling man (which I'm not), I'd bet that we won't have an intern for the next school year. With that said, our Council will make sure that we submit our application to be an internship site for August 2024.

I realize this is disappointing news. I was sorry to hear this, too. I've heard from so many people at Epiphany how much it's meant to be an internship site. I know we've all enjoyed having interns here and want this to continue to be one of our congregation's priorities.

Thanks, Epiphany, for all you do to grow, connect, and serve. I'm honored to be on this journey of faith with you.

We are continuing to work towards organizing a Capital Campaign for 2023-2024. Strong consideration is being given to engaging the services of GSB Consulting. As this will require a congregational vote of approval, a congregational meeting will be held on May 28th. A list of proposed projects to be funded will be developed.

Council has approved that Epiphany be designated as a place for temporary housing for Trinity Glen residents in the event of a disaster.

Time and Talent sign up are available. We encourage everyone to consider how they can best utilize their skills in serving the congregation.

The financial picture for the church and EECC remained strong for March. Revenue is good and expenses have remained low, resulting in a positive position for the first quarter.

Blessings and thanks to all who worship at Epiphany for their commitment, talents and support that help to make the church a welcoming place of worship.

The food pantry at Ibraham Elementary School has been serving 12-15 families twice a month this school year. "Extra" food including canned hams, spicy sauces, coffee, and protein bars were distributed before spring break. Several families need diapers and pull-ups and Epiphany members have continued to donate a small supply of diapers each month. Before summer break, boxes of food staples and canned hams will be given in addition to the "regular" food bags. Ibraham Food Pantry will be closed mid-June through Labor Day.

A Medical Update from Bishop Tim

Thanks to those too numerous to name for cards, calls, and inclusion in your prayer lists! It means so much to Wendy and me. I started hormone treatment (injections) in early April, and on June 5 and 20 I will have my two High Density Radiation (HDR) procedures in Charlotte. Presumably in early July, I will then begin daily External Beam Therapy (EBT) Radiation daily for about 5 weeks every weekday. The only times I know I'll definitely have to take it easy will be the few days immediately after each HDR and then I'll be dealing with fatigue and a few other minor challenges during the latter part of the EBT. The plan is to be well on the upswing by Labor Day.
