






Our congregation assembled 48 Welcome Bins for Refugee families. EECC families also participated in this project. They have been delivered to the synod office in Salisbury for immediate distribution. Well done, Epiphany!

We are now delivering weekend food bags to 81 students at Ibraham Elementary School each week and another 32 bags to Smith Farm Elementary every other week. FYI—we deliver DOUBLE loads before each long weekend and holiday break in the school schedule. Thanks to the "baggers," "box lifters," and delivery crews for making this happen each week. All this is made possible by Joyce Kohfeldt's generous gift. Sending a special "Thank you" up to Joyce in Heaven! She knew what it meant to do God's Work with Our Hands (and backs!)!!

Epiphany Builders built a handicapped ramp for a special friend of the congregation. And they are heading up to Lutherock soon to use their gifts for enhancing the buildings there. So proud of this group of special people!

Special thanks to the CBC "Crew" who donate their time and energy to stocking the shelves of the food pantry at Christ's Beloved Community. Over 120 families are served on each distribution day. We serve another 12 families at the Ibraham Elementary School food pantry twice a month. Epiphany is making a difference in the lives of people here in our community.

We will be providing 25 families at Ibraham with turkey dinners this year. Watch the weekly Star to see how you can help!

You can start buying winter hats, gloves and socks and a toy/puzzle for Ibraham students. We will be sponsoring 75 children this year. The "Angel Tree" will appear sometime this month so you can select your special child/children. The church will supply face masks and books for each student as well.

The Outreach Team has also been working on the budget for 2024 activities. It will be a new year full of opportunities for Our Hands to do God's Work!

Thanksgiving season reminds us to be grateful for our many blessings. During the month of November our circles will be collecting a special Thankoffering. In the early 1800's women's groups gave out small Thankoffering boxes as a visible reminder of blessing received. These boxes were collected in November, and the money received was used for church projects and to support foreign missionaries.

The founders of Women of the ELCA decided in 1988 that Thankofferings would be used to support the ongoing ministries of the churchwide women's organization. The ministries include our many online and printed communication channels, our justice and advocacy work, training and development for elected leaders, support of congregational and synodical women's organizations, the administration of grants and scholarship programs, all that goes into the business meetings of our Triennial Conventions, and more.

Thankofferings help us show gratitude for God's blessings and give us a tangible way to express that gratitude. These offerings are a tradition grounded in our celebration of community and of meeting together to joyfully give thanks for what God has given us.

"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning?" —Psalm 22:1



Dear church,

As Lutherans, we are accustomed to holding tension between two truths. Thus the ELCA denounces the egregious acts of Hamas, acts that have led to unspeakable loss of life and hope. At the same time the ELCA denounces the indiscriminate retaliation of Israel against the Palestinian people, both Christian and Muslim.

For the past week we have borne witness to the horrors of the escalating crisis between Israel and Hamas. We also watch a growing humanitarian crisis in Gaza as Israel blocks food, water, fuel and medical supplies and as airstrikes continue to cause unbearable civilian casualties ahead of a just-announced ground assault. We see Israelis and families around the world in the agonizing wait for word about the fate of loved ones killed or taken hostage by Hamas. We are in anguish, grieving and praying for all people who are living in trauma, fear and uncertainty.

Among us are Palestinian Lutherans who are fearful for their families, their communities and their homeland. In our communities we have Jewish and Muslim neighbors, who are also facing the horrors of this crisis and its impact on their loved ones.

It is difficult to find words that suffice in the complexity of this moment, and in the web of relationships that bind us together, as church, with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land and our interreligious partners. Yet God has called us to be a people who stand with others amid suffering.

We must also call a thing a thing. The power exerted against all Palestinian people — through the occupation, the expansion of settlements and the escalating violence — must be called out as a root cause of what we are witnessing. We are committed to our long-standing accompaniment of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land.

The God who liberates us calls us to be a liberating witness. May it be so.


